Building & Grounds Team

Oversees and provides general maintenance of the church building and grounds, including lawn care, snow removal, and Memory Garden & Labyrinth upkeep. This team also oversees building upgrades and renovations, classroom modifications, and other changes to our facility.

Caregiving Team

Coordinates the educational ministries of St. Peter's for adults and children. Includes preparation and facilitation of Worship & Wonder, Children's Worship, Nursery Care, Education Hour, Adult study experiences, and guest speakers/lecturers who broaden the knowledge base of our community.

Fellowship Team

Sponsors activities such as Dine with Nine, Ladies' Bunco Night, quarterly Fellowship Luncheons, youth fun nights (TGIF), seasonal parties, summer outings to Symphony on the Prairie and Fun in the Park, sporting events, concerts and other community-building opportunities.

Enhances the spiritual lives of the St. Peter's community by promoting worship opportunities, organizing retreats, serving as music ministry liaison, providing church publicity, keeping historical records, and maintaining banners, paraments, and other worship items. Provides spiritual nourishment through worship, discussion, and prayer.

Works closely with the Senior Pastor and Executive Team and helps to develop job descriptions and policies for the staff at St. Peter's. There are two elected members on this team per program year.
